



POLICY AND PROCEDURE NOTICE: PPPN-023 SUBRECIPIENT MEDICAID STATUS

Summary and Purpose of PPN: To guide the administration of the Ryan White Part A Program to ensure that Ryan White funds are the payer of last resort.

Authority:

- PHS ACT 2605(a)(6)
- Section 300ff-27(b)(7)(F) of Title 42 under the United States Code requires assurances from the that Ryan White funding will not be “utilized to make payments for any item or service to the extent that payment has been made or can reasonably be expected to be made . . .” by programs and sources other than Ryan White.

Policy and Procedure:

Subrecipients must comply with legislative requirements regarding the Medicaid status of providers.

1. Subrecipients are expected to vigorously pursue Medicaid enrollment for individuals who are likely eligible for coverage, to seek payment from Medicaid when they provide a Medicaid-covered service for Medicaid beneficiaries, and to back-bill Medicaid for RWHAP-funded services provided for all Medicaid-eligible clients upon determination.
2. Funded providers of Medicaid-reimbursable services must be participating in Medicaid and certified to receive Medicaid payments or able to document efforts underway to obtain such certification.
3. If Medicaid-covered services are funded, subrecipients must provide documentation of Medicaid certification.
4. All providers of services available in the Medicaid State plan must have entered into a participation agreement under the State plan and be qualified to receive payments under such plan, or receive a waiver from this requirement.
5. Subrecipients must include Medicaid reimbursements in each Quarterly Report.
